



GUEST SPEAKERS



Dr Karmen Wong

Dr Karmen Wong is a medical oncologist who is currently involved in the ongoing Lapatinib study in breast cancer and has participated in a multi-centre trial using Herceptin and chemotherapy for metastatic breast cancer. Her contributions include having pioneered the first multidisciplinary breast cancer treatment in Singapore. She also spearheaded the multidisciplinary tumour board and the Breast Cancer Clinic in Singapore General Hospital.



Dr William Wan

Dr William Wan is the General Secretary of the Singapore Kindness Movement. Being a lawyer and theologian, Dr Wan has taught at local universities and abroad, practiced law, ministered in churches and managed a wide range of companies including law firms, educational institutions and consulting firms. As an active author, he has written in support of the dyslexia and scouting community. He also speaks regularly at public events and conferences.

GUEST SPEAKERS



A/Prof James Yip

A/Prof James Yip is currently a cardiologist and associate professor at Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine. He developed the Cardiology Information System which is being used in three public hospitals in Singapore. A/Prof Yip currently serves as the Group Chief Medical Informatics Officer of the National University Health System and is Chief Data Advisor for the Ministry of Health. He has interests in using IT to improve the delivery of care for patients in the area of telemedicine, value driven outcomes and decision support systems.



Dr Soo Khee Chee

Dr Soo Khee Chee was the Founding Director of the National Cancer Centre Singapore and recently retired from that position after 20 years. He continues to hold the Benjamin Sheares Professorship in Academic Medicine. Dr Soo has wide ranging research interests but has gained a reputation particularly in the conduct of clinical trials for new cancer treatments as well as in the field of biophotonics and its role as a new imaging modality for the early detection of cancer.

Dr Leslie Lam

Dr Leslie Lam did his Cardiac Fellow at the Cardiothoracic Institute, Brompton Hospital, London. He subsequently served as the Deputy Head for the Department of Cardiology in 1987 at Singapore General Hospital before going into private practice. Dr Lam remains a visiting consultant at the Changi General Hospital and the National Heart Centre since 1997 and 1998 respectively.



Dr Bernard Kwok

Dr Bernard Kwok established the Singapore's first multidisciplinary Heart Failure Programme at the National Heart Centre of Singapore. He was the Director of the Programme and continues to care for patients with advanced heart failure and heart transplant recipients as a Visiting Consultant at the National Heart Centre Singapore.

Dr Maurice Choo

Dr Maurice Choo is currently Adjunct Professor with the Lee Kong Chian School of Medicine. He was Founding Chief and Professor for the Cardiac Department in National University Hospital, Singapore. His subspecialty areas of focus are percutaneous coronary intervention, heart failure, valvular heart disease, lipid disorders and hypertension.



Dr Ong Kim Kiat

Dr Ong Kim Kiat established the Pediatric Cardiac Surgery
Training Programme at Singapore General Hospital in the 1980s
when he was attached to the Department of Cardiothoracic
Surgery. Dr Ong was Head of Cardiothoracic Surgery at the
hospital from 1992 to 1995 and Director of the Singapore Heart
Centre (presently known as the National Heart Centre) from
1996 to 1997. His clinical interests include Pediatric Cardiac
Surgery and Coronary Artery Bypass Surgery.

Dr Carol Tan

Dr Carol Tan is a geriatrician by training. She is currently spearheading active ageing programmes that partners seniors and their families. This includes health screening, risk assessment, health literacy and follow-up programmes for the middle agers. She has been involved in direct patient care across the entire continuum including acute hospitals as well as in the intermediate and long term care sector. Her interests are in developing a person-centred, whole life, integrated, multidisciplinary, evidence based approach in the area of health and social care provision incorporating both the clinician as well as administrative and policy planning perspectives.



Dr Bobby Cheng

Dr Bobby Cheng specializes in cataract and comprehensive ophthalmology and his sub-specialty lies in vitreoretinal medicine, surgery and uveitis. As an active clinician, he has many publications in peer-reviewed journals and has presented at many international and regional conferences. His current research interest includes Dengue Maculopathy as well as Fourier Domain Optical Coherent Tomography (OCT) scanning of the retina.

Dr Carol Tham

Dr Carol Tham is a neurologist with special interest in acute ischaemic stroke and stroke in young adults. She studied medicine at the National University of Singapore where she graduated with a Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS). Dr Goh is actively involved in teaching as a clinical lecturer at Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, Adjunct Instructor at Duke-NUS Medical School and clinical tutor at Lee Kong Chian School of Medicine. She is currently practising as a consultant neurologist at National Neuroscience Institute.



Dr Bryan Tan

Dr Bryan Tan has a special interest in keyhole surgeries of the shoulder and elbow and has performed the largest number of complex bone transfer procedures via keyhole surgery in Singapore. He regularly conducts training courses for surgeons interested in learning keyhole surgeries of the shoulder and knee in Singapore and regional countries. Dr Tan participates in multiple sports including muay thai, power lifting and wakeboarding, giving him a deep understanding of sports-related injuries and how they can best be treated.

Dr Goh Kian Peng

Dr Goh Kian Peng is an endocrine specialist with a special interest in diabetes, thyroid disorders and exercise endocrinology. He studied medicine at the National University of Singapore where he was awarded the Dean's List and graduated with a Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) in 1996. Dr Goh is dually accredited in both endocrinology and internal medicine. He also completed a Master in Medicine (Family Medicine) and inducted as a member to the College of Family Medicine, Singapore. He is currently an Adjunct Assistant Professor with the Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine at NUS and a Visiting Consultant to KTPH, also sitting on the board of the Therapeutic Use Exemption Committee of Anti-Doping Singapore, Singapore Sports Council.



Dr Loh Ping Tyug

Dr Loh Ping Tyug is a renal physician with keen interest in glomerular diseases and diabetic kidney disease. She has presented multiple abstracts at major Nephrology scientific meetings in the region and internationally. She is also active in teaching at various educational institutions in medicine and health sciences. Prior to private practice, Dr Loh worked closely with family physicians in early detection and management of kidney diseases and received recognition for co-directing a prevention program for diabetic kidney disease at primary care setting.

Dr Paul Mok is an otolaryngologist with a distinguished career in public service for more than 23 years. He manages patients with a wide variety of ENT conditions which include nasal allergies, sinus infections, ear problems and swellings in the head and neck region. Dr Mok has been invited to many local, regional and international conferences and workshops to lecture, teach and perform live surgery in these two subspecialty areas. 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
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
